
On April 16, 2018, Victoria Gold secured Project Financing to fully finance the construction of the Eagle Gold Mine through to Commercial Production in 2019.

The Comprehensive C\$505 million construction financing package is comprised of:

Two credit facilities with Orion Mine Finance totalling	C\$	219 million
An equipment financing package with Caterpillar Financial	C\$	63 million
A gold royalty to Osisko Gold Royalties	C\$	98 million
Equity financing totalling	C\$	125 million
Total financing package:	C\$	505 million

"With this project financing package, Victoria is in a position to continue construction activities and advance the Eagle Gold Project to first gold pour, which we expect in the second half of 2019", commented John McConnell, President and CEO. "With this significant milestone behind us, we look forward to building a high-quality, profitable, and environmentally safe project that will deliver significant economic benefit to all of our stakeholders."

"Our Phase 1 construction activities, which commenced in August 2017, significantly de-risked the project and advanced detailed engineering to over 65% complete. We look forward to working with our new partners, Orion, Osisko, and Caterpillar, and all of our existing partners, including the First Nation of the Na-cho Nyak Dun (FNNND) and the Government of Yukon, to reach our next milestone of production from the Eagle Gold Mine.

WELCOME Message from the President

We are building the Eagle Gold Mine! We are pleased to announce that we have project financing to complete the construction of the Eagle Gold Mine through to commercial production in 2019. Our collective hard work and patience over the past few years will see the Eagle Gold Mine become a significant contributor to the Yukon economy, providing jobs and business opportunities for many years to come.

Construction activities at the Eagle Gold Project have accelerated and will build upon the milestones achieved in 2017, including:

- Doubling the existing camp to a 250 person capacity;
- Appointing two new VP positions, hiring a number of management positions, and employing a number of Mayo and FNNND citizens at site;
- Awarding the Eagle Gold Project Engineering, Procurement, Construction, Management (EPCM) contract to the JDS/Hatch Team;
- Signing a Power Purchase agreement with Yukon Energy Corp.;
- Completing the \$40 million Pre-Construction Phase 1 to prepare the site for full construction;
- Awarding a number of contracts to Yukon and First Nation businesses:
- Completing a \$12.5 million Exploration Program. Early results confirm the Olive-Shamrock deposit and the discovery of 3 new targets along the Potato Hills Trend: Popeye, Bluto, and Spinach.

In addition, we continue to be active in the community by supporting events, providing scholarships to FNNND students, bringing the Will Stroet and the Backyard Band to tour Yukon communities to help increase awareness of the *Every Student, Every Day* efforts to encourage all Yukon students to improve their school attendance.

Victoria is very proud to be a part of your community, and all of us at Victoria Gold look forward to a very exciting and active 2018 as we bring the Eagle Gold Mine into production.

South McQuesten and Haggart Creek Roads Traffic Plan

As Phase 2 Construction of the Eagle Gold Mine site is underway there will be an increase in traffic on the Silver Trail Highway, the South McQuesten Road (SMR) and the Haggart Creek Road (HCR). Victoria, as part of the environmental assessment process with input from the community, has developed the Eagle Gold Project Traffic Management Plan which describes the procedures and protocols for the use of the SMR, HCR and Eagle Gold site traffic. The \$40 million Phase 1 Construction Program was structured to de-risk the earthwork areas, and included completion of:

- Heap Leach Facility preparation
- Control Pond construction
- Project Access Road and bridge upgrades to improve safety
- Pioneering of site roads to Crusher area and Gold Plant Recovery area
- Expansion of the Camp to 250 bed capacity, along with a larger kitchen, dining and recreation facilities
- Advancing Detailed Engineering, now approximately 65% complete
- Securing competitive pricing on long-lead items
- Establishing effective project management, safety and health, and environmental control programs to continue through project development.

Victoria puts effort in to "right sizing" larger contracts when possible to facilitate participation by local vendors. Victoria has tendered approximately \$90 million worth of contracts to Yukon based companies, of which over half have economic connection to the NND Development Corp. by either First Nation business or local business.

2018 Phase 2 Construction Underway


Victoria started Phase 2 Construction right after the announcement of the project financing on March 8, 2018. The access road was opened and the camp has been operational since March 12. By mid April, there will be 250 people in camp. The next 18 months will transform the Eagle Gold Project into the Eagle Gold Mine, and Victoria Gold as a significant gold producer.

The timeline for Phase 2 Construction is as follows:



2017 Exploration Update

The \$12.5 million 2017 Exploration Program completed more then 34,000 metres of diamond drilling at the Dublin Gulch Claim block including at Olive-Shamrock and the Eagle West, Popeye, Spinach, Bluto and Catto targets. A modest exploration program is planned for 2018 as Victoria's main focus is on the construction of the Eagle Gold Mine.
