Welcome

I'm excited to be actively involved again in the Yukon as Victoria's Vice President, Yukon. You may remember me from StrataGold days when I spent a great deal of time in the Yukon. My mandate is to bring the Eagle Gold Project through permitting, construction and development.

We at Victoria are pleased to announce the recent appointment of John McConnell as the President and CEO. John was previously Victoria's Executive Vice President. Other new senior members are Ted Wilton, Vice President Exploration, and Bill Keats, Manager Yukon Exploration who will direct further exploration of the Dublin Gulch Property. Also, Todd Goodsell has joined Victoria as the Environmental Manager – Todd was formally with Stantec and has worked on the Eagle Gold Project for a number of years.

Since our last newsletter we have reached two significant milestones:

One is the submission of the Project Proposal for the Eagle Gold Project. This document kicks off the Project's Environment Assessment process by YESAB. Completion of this report has taken considerable concerted effort by our entire team over the past few years. We acknowledge that this progress has been made possible by the participation of the community. We thank members of the community and stakeholders for their continued interest, attendance and participation in our consultation activities.

The second milestone is initiating a bankable Feasibility Study. Wardrop will complete the Feasibility Study this year which determines and outlines the comprehensive engineering details of the future mine. The Project Proposal along with the Feasibility Study are significant documents as they will provide the basis used by government authorities in their decision to grant the permits required to construct and operate the mine.

In addition to the Eagle Gold Project activities, the company has planned a very aggressive exploration program in 2011. We have installed a 100-person all-season camp at Dublin Gulch to enable Victoria to conduct operations year-round.

We are also pleased to announce that we have established an office in Whitehorse. Our team welcomes Sarah Hannath to the team as the Office Administrator. As neighbours we look forward to participating locally and in meaningful ways to the community.

I look forward to meeting you at our various community events.

Environmental Assessment Process Underway

The Eagle Gold Project team celebrated the close of a successful year with the submission of the Project Proposal report to the Executive Committee of the Yukon Environmental Assessment Board (YESAB) on Dec 20, 2010. The Project Proposal does two things:

- 1 It describes the proposed development of the Eagle Gold Mine at Dublin Gulch.
- 2 It presents proposed mitigation in which to manage the potential environmental effects the development of the Eagle Gold Mine could have on both the physical and socio-economic environments.

This document also contains the various reports of studies that have been carried out over the past several years at the Eagle Gold property.

The Project Proposal is currently under initial review for adequacy – and we expect to hear from the YESAB in March that the report is ready to progress to the next phase of environmental screening. Stay tuned for ongoing developments in the Executive Committee Screening Review of the Eagle Gold Project.

Public participation in the review of the Project Proposal is greatly encouraged. The document will be available online at the YESAB public registry website: www.yesab.ca. Also, a printed copy of the Project Proposal is available at the NNDFN Government House.

Making Your Voice Count

A key part of assessments under YESAA is the guaranteed opportunity for individuals or groups to provide comments on projects being assessed. In order for those comments to be incorporated by assessors, it is very important that the content of the comments be structured in a meaningful and useable way. In order for your comments to be useful to assessors, you will need to outline what you value relative to the environment and the health and well-being of people, and explain how these things may be affected by a proposed development.



YESAB suggests that you frame your comments around the following four questions:

- 1 What do you value in the proposed project area?
- 2 How might those values be affected or impacted by the proposed project, and why?
- 3 Do you have any suggestions for how these effects could be reduced or eliminated?
- 4 Are your concerns based on your own experience, studies you are familiar with or information passed on to you from someone else?

NNDFN Visit Fort Knox Mine in Alaska

The last week of September was a pleasurable week spent in the community and a little further afield. The week started early with a meet and greet presentation about the Eagle Gold Project and supper at the curling rink in Mayo. The next day, Monday, the group of 13 mobilized to the airport and boarded a charter flight to Fairbanks Alaska. It was a beautiful clear and sunny day and Mount Denali (which is Koyukon Athabaskan for 'the High One'), North America's highest mountain at 20,320 feet (or 6,194m) came into view.

The sun continued to shine in Fairbanks as we toured the town. On day two we visited the site of Kinross's Fort Knox gold mine. The full day tour provided ample time to view the Heap Leach facility, the crusher, the open pit and the ore stockpiles. This visit provided the opportunity to see first hand an operating mine with similar processes and infrastructure planned at Eagle Gold with specific attention to the heap leach pad. Our Kinross tour guides from the Environment Department were very informative and helpful in answering all our questions. (Bonus – we each got to handle a solid gold bar worth \$330,000.00!).

Air North delivered the group safely back to Mayo on Wednesday. On Thursday, the group visited the Eagle Gold Project site with a better understanding of how the proposed heap leach gold mine at Eagle Gold will look and operate in the future.

Feasibility Study Underway



Victoria is pleased to announce that Wardrop, a Tetra Tech company is contracted to produce a bankable Feasibility Study for the Eagle Gold Project. Wardrop has solid experience in producing NI43-101 compliant feasibility studies as well as working in the north. Wardrop's most recent Yukon work has been on the detailed designs for Yukon Zinc's Wolverine mine and Alexco's Bellekeno mine. Their team is made up of experienced design engineers and project managers experienced with the delivery of feasibility studies and detailed design work. Victoria looks forward to introducing members of Wardrop's team as design progresses.

A Feasibility Study is a detailed evaluation of a proposed mining project to determine how the mineral resource can be mined economically and is a key document to determine how Victoria should proceed with building the mine. This study determines the cost of developing and operating the mine relative to the revenue it will generate over the life of the mine. We expect that this study will be completed by Q4 2011. The next step will be the Detailed Design stage which prepares the blueprints for constructing the mine.

Victoria Expands Camp at Eagle

Victoria is installing a new 100 person camp to replace the long standing 30 person exploration camp. This expanded camp will support the Company's expanded, year round exploration plans on its wholly owned Dublin Gulch property. The Envionmental Assessment process and Project Proposal for the camp is underway.

The camp will have single occupancy rooms, a modern kitchen which can feed up to two hundred plus people, semi-private washrooms, washer and dryer facilities, and an expanded recreation area. Workers will enjoy more comfort as each bedroom has lockable storage, is hooked up for cable vision and wireless internet service, and comes with its own adjustable baseboard heating unit. Water supply will come from a new well and filtration system to produce drinking water. Sewage will be treated on site through a state of the art membrane biological reactor (MBR) system which produces high quality treated water for discharge. Power will be supplied by two brand new Caterpillar, 250 kW diesel generators.

Installation of the new camp began in October with the preparation of the camp pad area, and since then all the camp module units and service modules have been installed. Final commissioning of the camp is scheduled for late February with occupancy shortly thereafter.


Expanded Exploration Program in 2011

We are looking forward to a very busy year ahead in 2011. In addition to supporting the Eagle Gold Project Feasibility Study activities, the exploration team will be casting its net further afield and looking in detail at the whole Dublin Gulch claim block with the aim of developing and discovering new targets. The ultimate goal of our exploration plan is to extend the projected life of mining beyond the present 8 and a half years. We hope to be your best neighbours for many years to come.

Last year, we focused much of our work on an east-west belt of rocks we call the Potato Hills Trend, and discovered excellent indicators of mineralization for more than 7 km along this belt. The geology and minerals are slightly different from our Eagle deposit, in particular we found much more silver as well as gold. This year, we will be looking to both east and west along the belt which we believe to extend for at least 14 km.

As well as our Dublin Gulch claim block, we shall also be advancing our Aurex block of claims, which lies about 20 km south of Dublin Gulch, next to the silver mining

camp at Elsa and Keno, and which contains some exciting geology and mineral potential.
