Nuway has an all First Nations crushing crew at the Eagle Gold Mine made up of citizens from Na-Cho Nyak Dun, Little Salmon/Carmacks First Nation and Ross River Dena Council. The company also has partnerships with several First Nations throughout the Yukon and northern B.C. and holds a preferred vendor agreement with the Na-Cho Nyak Dun Development Corporation (NND DC). Ninetyfive (95) to 100 per cent of Nuway's hires are local from communities throughout the Yukon and the NWT.

The Eagle Gold Mine, currently under construction, is part of Victoria's 100 per cent-owned Dublin Gulch gold property located approximately 375 kilometres north of Whitehorse and 85 kilometres north, northeast of the Village of Mayo within the traditional territory of the First Nation of Na-Cho Nyak Dun. The property is accessible by road year-round and is within Yukon Energy's electrical grid.

The Eagle Gold Mine has received all major permits for construction and operations, completed the Yukon Environmental and Socio-economic Assessment Board (YESAB) process and mutually created and
