

DESPITE THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC

AND RESPONSE MEASURES AT YUKON COLLEGE that suspended face-to-face classes and workshop access earlier this spring, the five students enrolled in the Pre-Apprentice Millwright program all successfully transitioned to online learning, completed the program and graduated.

Including Cody Joe, who was immediately hired by Victoria Gold and started work as a maintenance labourer at the Eagle Gold Mine on May 13. A Champagne and Aishihik First Nations citizen, in his role at the mine, Cody will support the site millwright and welding journeymen.

"I'm excited to work at the Eagle Gold Mine," says Cody. "My Yukon College program was fantastic. I loved working with all the machinery and the small class-size meant there was lots of one-on-one time with our Millwright instructor."

"We're pleased to work with the Centre of Northern Innovation in Mining (CNIM) at Yukon College to further the education of Yukoners and offer meaningful employment for qualified graduates. We are very pleased to have Cody Joe join the Eagle Gold Mine team as a labourer for Fixed Maintenance," says John McConnell, President & CEO, Victoria Gold Corp.
