

AS GENERAL FOREMAN, MINE OPERATIONS AT VICTORIA GOLD'S EAGLE GOLD MINE, Andrew Ballance has an early start each day during his two-week rotation at site.

"I wake up at 5:15 a.m. to be in the office by 5:45 to meet up with the mine's night shift foreman," says Andrew. "I then lead a 'hand over' meeting, which is also attended by the maintenance foreman and the engineering and geology groups for updates on what was accomplished the night before to plan and prioritize the activities for the day ahead."

Andrew then attends the daily 'tailgate', which brings together the entire day shift Mine Operations crew to discuss safety and ensure production stays on track. After breakfast is a daily management meeting at which he provides an update on the mine's operations over the past 24 hours followed by mine tours with the foreman, then the engineering and geology groups and the Drill and Blast Foreman.

"Part of my job also involves escorting managers or guests that may be visiting site on tours of the mine when requested," continues Andrew. "After lunch, I typically spend a few hours on employee recruitment whether that entails reviewing resumes or conducting telephone interviews with potential candidates. My current focus is on experienced equipment operators and haul truck trainees, with a focus on Yukoners."

After dinner, there is another meeting at 6:10 p.m., which mirrors the morning meeting, this time lining up the night shirt foreman. Andrew finishes his work day when the day shift crew is all wrapped up; typically, at 7:15 p.m.


