

SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS CONTINUED **THROUGH JANUARY AND FEBRUARY** at Victoria Gold's Eagle Gold Mine, as the project advances to its first gold pour in the second half of the year; positioning the Eagle Gold Mine to be Yukon's next, and largest, operating gold mine.

The structural steel erection of the Primary Crusher nears completion and the building's exterior cladding has started. The crusher machinery will be

installed this month. The roof of the Secondary/Tertiary Crusher building will be installed in later February and the building's exterior cladding is set to start, while the mechanical installations continue to advance.

Fifty (50) per cent of the 1.4-kilometrelong Overland Conveyor System structures have been installed. The underdrain system of the mine's Heap Leach Facility is in progress and

the detailed planning for this year's operational activities are well advanced.

The electrical power line will be completed this month and work has started on the assembly and commissioning of the main transformers, linking the mine to Yukon Energy's grid. Victoria and its team of contractors are currently developing the Open Pit Access Road up to the mine starter pit.
