With this year's contribution, *Every Student, Every Day* will have raised and distributed \$1.5 million to directly support community-led projects designed to boost student attendance; increasing its project funding to \$250,000. The Government of Yukon has also increased its contribution this year to \$50,000 for a total of \$300,000 available.

Since its establishment in 2012, Every Student, Every Day, through the support of community partners, businesses and individuals, has directly supported more than 140 local projects. "Every Student, Every Day has numerous 'Success Stories' on our website to inspire you as you brainstorm and propose a project that will increase student attendance in your community," continues Christie. "We extend our sincere appreciation to our educators who are working tirelessly during the COVID-19 pandemic to create an environment in which our students can learn and we are very proud to work with our partners to help support them address student attendance challenges."
