

SINCE 2012, THE NOT-FOR-PROFIT VICTORIA GOLD YUKON STUDENT ENCOURAGEMENT SOCIETY, AND ITS EVERY STUDENT, EVERY DAY INITIATIVE, has

worked with Yukon Government, Yukon First Nations and mining community champions to help improve student attendance in our territory's schools.

To date, fundraising efforts have raised well over \$650,000, in addition to hundreds of thousands of dollars in products and services donated in-kind, to directly support 90 grassroots, community-led student attendance projects in almost every Yukon community. The application deadline for projects in the 2020-2021 school year is approaching on March 12, 2020.



Student attendance proposals are encouraged from:

- schools, teachers, school councils and the Yukon Francophone School Board (Commission scolaire francophone du Yukon);
- Yukon First Nations;
- community organizations and student/parent clubs; and
- partnerships between the above.

Two new categories for proposals include, though are not limited to:

- creating communication projects/products schools and students communicating on issues of attendance; and
- fostering Reconciliation with Yukon First Nations through addressing the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada: Calls to Action — working to enhance First Nations ways of knowing and doing with schools to promote attendance and engagement in schools.

This current school year, *Every Student, Every Day* awarded \$100,000 to support 20 projects and this year we are able to substantially increase the efforts to improve attendance by having \$150,000 available for distribution.

"Our volunteer board is so pleased to work with Yukoners and appreciates their commitment to helping make a positive impact in the lives of Yukon students," says Victoria Gold Yukon Student Encouragement Society President Tara Christie. "Student absenteeism affects us all and we're honoured to work with our dedicated community partners and the community to help address student attendance challenges here in the territory."
