Encouragement Society and its volunteerdriven Every Student, Every Day initiative to help address student absenteeism in our territory's schools is a key pillar of the company's commitment to the health and well-being of all Yukoners.

Integral to Every Student, Every Day's efforts to encourage Yukon students to attend school each day and every day is pre-school literacy and the involvement of families in fostering success in school and in life.

Each year, with this holistic approach, Victoria Gold supports the fundraising efforts of the Yukon Imagination Library and its long-running pre-school literacy program. Brought to the territory by the Rendezvous Rotary Club of Whitehorse in 2007, the library purchases and sends one free book each month to Yukon children from their birth to the age of five. To date, over 100,000 books have been distributed to families in every Yukon community.

This year, to directly support the organization's fundraising auction at the Yukon Geoscience Forum & Trade Show Banquet, held on November 18 in Whitehorse, Victoria donated a 14.1-gram gold nugget. The nugget was a popular item at this annual industry event and attendees donated generously to the auction, which raised almost \$30,000.

Another signature event in this season of giving is the Yukon Hospital Foundation's Northwestel Festival of Trees Alkan Air Grand Ball, held on Saturday, November 30. This is an important event for the Victoria Gold team and an opportunity to connect with the community and celebrate the generous spirit of Yukoners.

Established in 2005, the Yukon Hospital Foundation raises funds for state-of-the-art medical equipment, services and facilities for Whitehorse, Watson Lake and Dawson City hospitals including an MRI and CT Scan and Victoria Gold donates thousands of dollars to the Foundation each year.

The property is accessible by road year-round and is connected to Yukon Energy Corp's electrical grid. The mine will be a significant contributor to Yukon employing 350 to 400 people.
