


ON SATURDAY, JUNE 22, SHIPYARDS

artisans and musicians to co-host the Aboriginal Peoples Television Network (APTN) **Indigenous Day Live** celebrations; along with similar, simultaneous events in Calgary and Winnipeg.

Victoria Gold was a proud sponsor of what has become the country's largest event in recognition of **National Indigenous Peoples Day** and the company's Community Liaison, Michelle Dawson-Beattie was on site to address the gathering.

"I was privileged to deliver greetings from John McConnell, Victoria's President and CEO," says Michelle. "John is a long-time



northerner and wished he could be there to celebrate this very important day with everyone in the park and across the country through APTN's national broadcast."

Thirteen years ago, APTN spear-headed the first edition of Indigenous Day Live, which was held in a park outside the network's downtown headquarters in Winnipeg. Since then, the event has grown and is held in different Canadian cities each year.

"National Indigenous Peoples Day is a day for all Canadians to recognize and celebrate the unique heritage, diverse cultures and outstanding contributions of First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples," says McConnell. "We were so pleased to help support this event and share Yukon First Nations' culture right across the country."

Construction of Victoria's Eagle Gold Mine is complete and is now in operations as the company prepares for the mine's first gold pour in September. At present more than 50 per cent of Victoria's employees are Yukoners, of which 40 per cent are First Nations; including 20 Na-Cho Nyak Dun citizens, within whose traditional territory the mine is located.

The property is accessible by road year-round and is connected to Yukon Energy Corp's electrical grid. The mine will be a significant contributor to Yukon employing 350 to 400 people.
